#### 1. Background & Introduction

In 2021, the Monash Student Association (**MSA**) undertook a competitive tendering process to select a provider to conduct its 2021, 2022 and 2023 annual elections. OGL Group was appointed through this process to conduct the elections, continuing its provision of these services to the MSA since 2010.

This year saw a return to on-campus campaigning, with voting to remain online. In accordance with provisions in the Regulations, the dates of polling were called by the MSC, with other electoral deadlines being consequently set by the Regulations and the Constitution and publicised through the notice of the election.

OGL Group was to run the MSA Annual Elections consistent with the rules and Regulations as set down by MSA and the National Union of Students (**NUS**). OGL was to work with the University and student body to make sure the election process ran as set down, that election participants were well informed, and that good standards of behaviour and participation were expected and enforced.

The MSA contracted BigPulse to provide the voting platform for the 2022 MSA Elections.

Jessica Fox was appointed as the Returning Officer for the 2022 MSA Elections by a resolution of the Monash Student Council and is the author of this report.

#### 2. Process

#### Communication

On the MSA website there was a dedicated election page (http://msa.monash.edu/elections) which contained the details of the election, the rules of the election (Constitution and Regulations) and the contact details of the RO. All notices, forms, rulings and declarations were posted on this page as required.

The RO also frequently communicated with candidates and ticket Authorised Officers (**AOs**) via email, text and phone calls to ensure that all relevant parties were adequately informed regarding the election process.

#### Election 2022

Election dates were set by a resolution of the MSC. The governing documents for the election process were the MSA Constitution and the Election Regulations.

Notice was given on Monday 1 August 2022 for Annual Elections to be held from Monday 19 September to Thursday 22 September 2022 (**see Appendix 1 – Notice of Election**). In addition to being posted on the MSA website an email was sent to all Clayton students alerting them to the Notice of Election.

An MSA Election Timetable was also published to assist students in meeting the requirements of the Regulations (see Appendix 2 – Election Timetable).

Contact was made by the RO with the William Cooper Institute to ensure that all students identifying as Indigenous were informed of the election, informed about the position of Indigenous Officer and how to nominate for the position.

Candidates were required to lodge all election forms via email.

All candidate statements, photos and publicity requiring authorisation were lodged electronically throughout the election process.

#### Tickets

Ticket re-registrations opened at 9am on Monday 1 August and closed 5pm on Friday 5 August. A list of re-registered tickets was then published on Monday 8 August (**See Appendix 3 – List of Re-registered ticket names**).

Registrations for new ticket names opened at 9am on Tuesday 9 August and closed 5pm on Monday 15 August. The list of new ticket name registration applications was then published at 5pm on Tuesday 16 August, including details of re-registered ticket names (see Appendix 4 – List of all registered ticket names).

All ticket re-registrations and registrations submitted by the deadline fulfilled the requirements as set down by the Regulations.

#### Nominations

Nominations opened at 9am on Wednesday 17 August and closed 5pm on Friday 26 August 2022.

Nominations were received for all positions and the following positions/committees were declared elected unopposed:

A provisional Notice of Nominations Received was posted on 30 August, prior to confirmation of all candidates' eligibility.

The University provided an electronic roll to the RO, which enabled the validity of most of the nominations to be checked directly by the RO. In instances where a student did not appear on the roll, the RO determined eligibility based on the information on the statement of enrolment provided by the student. This was the process for ticket registration, nominations and voting.

A final list of nominees was posted on 8 September after the ballot draw and receipt of candidate order forms from the Authorised Officers (see Appendix 5 – Final List of Nominations Received and Declaration of Positions Elected Unopposed).

In summary, for the 2022 MSA elections:

- 154 valid nominations were received
- 2 nominations submitted were invalid
- 1 nomination was withdrawn
- 7 ticket names were successfully registered or re-registered

#### **Ballot Draw**

Despite the election being conducted online and the BigPulse voting platform allowing for randomised ballot order for each student, the Returning Officer determined that a draw was required for the ordering of the election guide and to cover the front page order for tickets as this cannot be randomised under the BigPulse platform. Those participating in the election as candidates and ticket registrants were invited to attend, and this was conducted on 31 August via Zoom using a random number generator.

#### 3. Voting & Results

#### Polling

Polling in the 2022 MSA Elections was conducted online through the BigPulse voting platform with all eligible students receiving a unique voting link via their student email. This link was sent at the opening of polling and was sent again at 12pm Wednesday 21 September to students that had not yet voted.

#### Counting

Following the close of polls, the Returning Officer was immediately provided with detailed count sheets from BigPulse that included raw voting numbers, the number of votes received for each Office Bearer position and quota requirements for all multi-member positions. These vote counts were checked for accuracy before being posted. This year, the Returning Officer detected an anomaly with the application of quota in the contested Committees and the NUS Delegates count and undertook a manual recount to ensure the ballot results were accurately counted and calculated according to the requirements of a falling quota.

#### **Declarations of results**

For all contested ballots, barring the contested Committees and the NUS Delegate ballot, results were declared at 6pm on Thursday 22 September 2022 (for full results see Appendix 6 – Notice of Results). Contested Committee and NUS Results were finalised after a manual recount, and these were finalised and declared on Friday 23 September. Results were posted on the MSA website following the declaration by the Returning Officer and all candidates were notified directly by email.

#### **Recounts and Appeals**

No requests for recounts or appeals were received following the declaration of results.

#### Participation

Participation was lower in the MSA Elections this year in comparison with 2021 both in the number of candidates contesting the election (156 nominations received in 2022 compared to 227 in 2021) and the number of voters (2262 in 2022 compared to 5561 in 2021). This represented 5.3% of all eligible voters participating in the election. A steady decline in voter participation across the ballots also occurred as students were not required to vote in all ballots. The first ballots listed got the highest participation totals and the last ballots listed recorded the lowest (the MSA President ballot achieved 1902 votes whilst the People of Colour Committee ballot achieved 560 votes).

The following table summarises the times during which students cast their votes, with spikes in voting following each email being sent.

#### **Affirmative Action**

Affirmative Action provisions did not need to be enacted as enough women students were elected to all multi-member positions.

#### 4. Issues & Recommendations

This section deals with problems that arose with the election process or logistics, as well as overall commentary about conduct and process. It is not intended to be an exhaustive account of each issue that became necessary for the Returning Officer to consider.

#### **Hybrid Campaigning Conduct**

As this was the first election where in-person campaigning was conducted in conjunction with electronic polling, some campaigners did not clearly understand rules surrounding the violation of the secrecy of the ballot. This resulted in some campaigning bans being issued to election participants who were either voting on behalf of another voter (by touching their device) or by standing over a voter and having clear sight of their voting screen as they are casting their vote. While this was better understood as the polling week progressed, the MSA Regulations are not explicit with what campaigners can and cannot do when a voter is casting a vote on their personal device.

#### Recommendation 1/2022

To ensure the secrecy of the ballot, the MSA Election Regulations be amended to clearly delineate what actions election participants may or may not take when a voter is casting their vote in front of an election participant who is campaigning to them.

#### **Disabilities and Carers Committee Election**

As mentioned in last year's report, the election of the Disabilities and Carers Committee has sat outside the annual MSA elections for the last couple of years, instead requiring an election of their own under the rules set down in the MSA Committee Regulations. Given the Disabilities and Carers office-bearer position is elected in the Annual MSA elections, the MSA should incorporate the Disabilities and Carers Committee Election into the main MSA election process. This is also to ensure compliance with section 38(3) of the MSA Constitution which states that all members of MSA Committees directly elected by students must be elected at the annual elections.

#### Recommendation 2/2022

That the MSA review the current election settings in place for the Disabilities and Carers Committee and make appropriate changes to clarify election rules in place for this committee, and to ensure compliance with the MSA Constitution.

#### 6. Conclusion

This year's elections saw the MSA hold their annual elections in a hybrid format with online voting and campaigning occurring in person. The MSA framework governing the election largely worked smoothly with the hybrid format, with election participants navigating the hybrid model relatively straightforwardly within the new format.

Thanks go to all the staff involved in running the elections, including our OGL Group staff, and especially MSA and University staff who assisted in various ways throughout the election. In particular, my thanks go to Lowan Sist, Sylvia Francisca, Elizaveta Dilanyan, Addison Hung and Damian Petrov.

University staff who also deserve a special mention for their assistance are Candisse Joseph, Rebecca Hodgkin, Miranda Brand, Anna Carusello and indeed the whole team from Student Education and Business Services. As always you were an excellent example of skilled and helpful Monash staff members, and student elections would not occur without your work.

I wish all successful candidates the very best as they undertake their new responsibilities in the coming year.
